- 3. The Chief Medical Officer under advisement by Trust Thrombosis Group
- 4. Training is provided via e-Learning. Face-to-face and virtual training on VTE is also provided within a rolling programme and includes (but is not limited to):
  - Trust clinical induction to all new starters.
  - Nurses recruited overseas as part of their OSCE training.
  - Junior Doctors on 4-monthly rotation.

Sessions are also routinely provided to Theatres, Surgical teams and stroke wards. Target areas such as Maternity, AMUs, SDEC and some medical wards are provided with ongoing education and support as part of quality improvement projects. Regular workshops with all staff on awareness days (World Thrombosis Day etc.) which is usually every 6 months.
